Why Paul was Thankful for Philemon:


- hearing of your love and faith which you have toward the Lord Jesus and toward all the saints,

- 2 fulfill my joy by being like-minded, Phil 2:1-2










Why Paul was Thankful for Philemon:


- having the same love,

- 5 Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, Phil 2:2-6



























This is the Prayer's Starting Point
